# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019.

The information as set out on page 1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with statutory requirements and the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

## 1. Structure, Governance & Management

Children's Health and Development in Kenya (CHADIK) was registered as a charity on 10 April 2012 and was established under a Memorandum of Association which sets out its objects and powers and is governed under its Articles of Association.

The Trustees are all familiar with the objects of the charity. They are responsible for strategic direction and policy and they review the risks of operation. They meet on a regular basis as a Management Committee. The Trustees who have served during the year and to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

In December 2018, The Rt Reverend Mark Sowerby, Bishop of Horsham, advised that he would like to step down as one of the two Patrons due to new responsibilities. These wishes have been accepted with regret.

### 2. Objectives, Activities and Achievements

### Objectives:

To benefit the peoples of Kenya by acting as an umbrella / resource body with specific focus supporting outreach medical clinics to areas with no paediatric support.

#### **Activities and Achievements:**

- a) funding for the Kisima School project was concluded during the year. The CHADIK students will be taking their school leaving exams in October.
- b) the outreach clinics, provided by Gertrude's Hospital Foundation (GHF), which is based in Nairobi, are being carried out on a monthly basis in the Laikipia region of Eastern Kenya.

These clinics reach and diagnose hundreds of sick children in rural areas where local medical facilities are poor or non-existent. Each of the clinics is led by a doctor/paediatrician and includes a nurse/counsellor and a nutritionist.

During the calender year 2018, outreach clinics have been held at Dol Dol, Likii, Solio and Nanyuki. In total, 985 patients have been examined and treated.

Following initial discussions with GHF, they have indicated that they would like to move away from the outreach clinics towards a child cancer awareness project. Whilst this change is still in the planning stage is likely that CHADIK will support this new initiative.

## 4. Financial Review

During the year income exceeded expenditure by £437 resulting in Unrestricted Funds of £26,625 being available to be carried forward.

During the year the Kisima School project benefitted from a further grant of £2,400 from the Richard Lawes Foundation and the Gertrude's Outreach Clinics benefitted from a grant of £1,000 from the Pat Newman Memorial Trust.

Apart from the above grants, income during the year was primarily raised from donations from CHADIK's regular supporters who gave most generously, particularly at the various fund raising activities. Wherever possible, these supporter donations were supplemented by Gift Aid.

The Trustees would like to take this opportunity to formally thank the major donors and all the regular supporters for their kind contributions during the year which really made a difference to the ongoing operations and activities.

As the Income for the year was less than £25,000, an Independent Examiner's Report was not required.

The Trustees aim to always have a minimum of £15,000 of available reserves so that there is cover for the following year's Outreach Clinics.
